

**RESOLUTION OF TOWN BOARD PROPOSING TO EXCEED LEVY LIMIT
VIA SPECIAL TOWN ELECTOR MEETING**

**Town of Birnamwood, Shawano County
Resolution No. 22-01**

Whereas, the State of Wisconsin has imposed levy limits on town, village, city, and county levies for 2022 and thereafter under Wis. Stat. § 66.0602;

Whereas, Wis. Stat. § 66.0602 limits the allowable local levy for 2022 to a percentage increase of no more than the greater of (a) zero percent of the 2021 payable 2022 adjusted actual levy as calculated under the state's levy limit law or (b) a percentage equal to the percent change in equalized value due to net new construction less improvements removed, which for the Town of Birnamwood is 1.369 %;

Whereas, the **Town Board of the Town of Birnamwood**, Shawano County, believes that for the 2022 tax levy (to be collected in 2023) it is in the town's best interest to exceed the state levy limit as described above by a greater percentage than 1.369 %;


Whereas, the Town of Birnamwood's 2021 payable 2022 adjusted actual tax levy was \$87,877, and further whereas the state law would limit this year's increase to \$89,080, for a total allowable town tax levy *before* adjustments for 2022 (to be collected in 2023) of \$89,034;

THEREFORE, the **Town Board of the Town of Birnamwood**, Shawano County does hereby resolve and order as follows:

1. The **Town Board** supports an increase in the town tax levy for 2022 and ongoing that will exceed the amount allowed by the state levy limit.
2. The **Town Board** directs that the question of increasing the allowable town tax levy for 2022 and ongoing (to be collected in 2023) by 39.61 %, which would increase the town levy by \$35,268, for a total town tax levy (*after* adjustments) of \$124,302, shall be placed on the agenda for the **Special Town Elector Meeting** to be held on October 27, 2022.
